SYLLABUS OF EMBROIDERY & NEEDLE WORK UNDER CRAFTEMAN TRAINING SCHEME

General Introduction

1. Course Objective

The objective of the course is to give the trainees the necessary skills and knowledge in embroidery techniques by hand, treadle, sewing machine and automatic zigzag lock stitch machine so that they are able to seek self employment or industrial employment as semi-skilled workers.

2. Trainee Entry Level

Passed 10th class or its equivalent.

3. Duration of Training

One year.

6. Trainee Exit Level

On completion of course of one year, the trainees are expected to be able to:

- (a) Use tools and equipments required for embroidery and needle work.
- (b) Identify fabrics in relation to the trade.
- (c) Stitch & embroidery by hand, treadle sewing machine and automatic zig zag lockstitch machine.
- (d) Estimate material for various articles and house hold linen.

Note: The course content for the subject of social studies being common for all trades are not in-corporate in the syllabus.
