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General Information

1. Objective of the course

The objective of this course is to impart basic skill and knowledge to trainee in the trade of Hair & Skin care so that they are able to either seek employment as a beautician in a beauty parlour/saloon or run their own beauty parlour providing basic services.

2. Trainee Entry Level

Passed class X examination of 10 + 2 pattern or an equivalent examination.

3. Course Duration

The duratio0n of the course shall be one year of full time attendance of 40 hours/weeks.

4. Modular Break Up

The course is divided in tree main modules

- I) **General Module.** Covering Personality development & Reception and anatomy & Physiology.
- II) **Hair Care.** Covering scalp massage and shampooing, hair cutting and styling, colouring & perming.
- III) **Skin care.** Covering manicure & pedicure, facial message & make up, superficial hair removal and eyebrow shaping and beaching.

5. Trainee Exit Level

On completion of training, the trainees are expected to be able to:

- (a) Know the techniques of handling customers and present her-self.
- (b) Cut the hair in different styles using the various cutting tools and wet the hair temporarily and permanently.
- (c) Give artificial colour to hair with chemical and vegetable dyes.
- (d) Recognize skill types and treating them accordingly with various facial techniques.
- (e) Maintain hands/feet in healthy condition and decorate them with mehandi.
- (f) Remove superfluous facial and body hair as painlessly as possible without damaging clients
- (g) Accentuate good features with different make up techniques.

3. Anatomy of facial and neck muscles:

Elementary characteristics of muscles of the body and their actions, mobility of the body and its physiology. Joints of the body and their actions (related to the course).

4. Skin and Appendages:

Structure of skin and appendages (detail related to course only) distribution, growth, life span, colour, texture, and graying to hair.

5. Structure of nail and their forms, microscopic appearance of skin.

- 2. **Shampooing and Rinsing:** Observation of scalp, preparation of trolley, selection of shampoo accordingly to hair type, application of shampoo, procedure.

(b) HAIR CUTTING & STYLING

 - (d) Artificial aids- purpose, types, cleaning and maintaining.

- (b) Blow drying of hair- preparing the trolley & client, practices of setting hair with dryer-out turn, straightening with the help of hand dryer.
- (c) Back brushing- backcombing procedure, styling long hair in various types of braids, rolls, interlocks, casual styles, etc.
- (d) Artificial aids- styling, fixing on the head and switch stand.
